Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program with 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.

- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates)
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates Unavailable for Employment” means the graduates who, after graduation, die become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United State, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates Employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning with six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employed in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Graduates taking Exam” is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

We will provide a full refund of money you have paid toward tuition, fees, and other charges if you:

1. STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

- You may cancel your contract for school, without any penalty or obligation on or before the latter of (i) the fifth business day following your first class session and (ii) the seventh day after you sign the enrollment agreement as described in your Notice of Cancellation form that will be given to you on the first day of class. Read the Notice of Cancellation form for an explanation of your cancellation rights and responsibilities. If you have lost your Notice of Cancellation form, ask the school for a sample copy.
 - After the end of the cancellation period, you also have a right to stop school at any time and you have the right to receive a refund for the part of the course not taken. Your refund rights are described in the in the Tuition Refund Policy.
 - Cancellation: shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation at the institution's address. You can do this by mail, hand delivery, or email. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when it is deposited in the mail properly addressed with prepaid postage. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form, however expressed; it is effective if it shows that you no longer wish to be bound by the enrollment agreement. On the first day of class, you will be given two notices of cancellation forms for your use if you decide to cancel, however, you can use any written notice that you may wish.
 - If the school closes before you graduate, you may be entitled to a pro-rata refund of tuition. Contact The **Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education** at the address and phone number printed below for information.
 - A student or any member of the public may file a complaint about this institution with the **Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education** by calling toll-free (888) 370-7589 or by completing a complaint form, which can be obtained on the Bureau's website a: www.bppe.ca.gov
2. If we cancel a start date, you can opt to move any monies paid into an alternate start date or request a refund. The delay could last up to ninety (90) days. We may need to cancel a start date due to the size of the student body, repairs to the facility, or other operational issues.
3. If TONI&GUY Hairdressing Academy terminates you for failure to complete all required coursework in the program within 125% of the stated length of the program or because of failure to comply with the requirements, rules, and regulations outlined in the catalogue, your enrollment will be terminated. The extent of any refund due to you will be determined according to our Tuition Refund Policy.
